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Light Orange Mid-Length Skirt
Standard Machine Knitting Pattern



This skirt is knitted with my [Silver Reed SK 840](#) electronic knitting machine.

Stockinette Gauge Swatch Measures:

- 40 sts x 60 rows: width: 9cm (3.5 in); height: 7.5cm (3 in)

Tension dial setting

- stitch dial 1, tension 7

- 2 threads of light orange cotton yarn Nm 1/15

First of all, excuse my english mistakes because english is not my native language but I am pretty sure you can understand my instructions, if not, feel free to contact me using this form:

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The skirt is knitted sideways in one piece. For size S (my size) I knitted until it measured around 100 cm (39.4 in) at the waist even though I am 85 cm (33.5 in) at the waist level where I wanted the skirt to stay, this is a low-waist skirt. It was measured with approximation while it was still on the machine. If you're a bigger size, continue knitting until you think it is appropriate to stop.

Cast on 200 sts - the full bed of my standard knitting machine. I consider the waist of the skirt at the left and the bottom of the skirt at the right. Start with your carriage at right. I used waste yarn and ravel cord because I wanted to knit the margins on the machine bed and not sew them using kitchener stitch. In my opinion, it looks much nicer this way.

Row 1-10: knit all 200 sts - Carriage at the right

R11: hold 29 sts at the left and knit

R12: hold 1 sts in the left (LN71) and knit

repeat 6 times R11-12

Now there are 20 sts left for work (RN81-RN100). The carriage is at the right

R23: unhold 2 sts from the right, RN 79 and RN 80, and knit

R24: hold RN79 and knit

R25: knit

R26: hold RN80 and knit

repeat R24-26, 2 times (next row will be R30)

repeat 5 times, R23-R29 (next row will be R58)

repeat R1-R57 as many times as needed until the skirt reaches the wanted size, for me it was 100cm measured at the waist (left size of the bed)

After you finish take it out on the ravel cord and waste yarn.

Next put one side of the skirt back on the machine with right (as in right and wrong side) side facing you and the other margin above it (so the both right sides are facing each other and the wrong sides are outside). Knit 1 row, put your stitch dial at 6 and knit one more row. Cast off using the latch tool (my recommendation because it's easier and looks so much better) or your favourite way of doing it.

For the waist band, put half of the skirt on the machine wrong side facing you. I used every other hole, not those with knots, knit 30 rows, then put back up the same stitches you used originally, in order to make a hem. Cast off extremely loose, stitch dial at 10. Repeat for the other part. I used an elastic through the hem.

After you finish, weave the thread ends, and steam the skirt so it can arrange nicely.
